## What has been happening in school? Curriculum, teaching and learning achievements.

#### Building up to VE Day

To prepare for our VE day we are practicing some war time songs and the waltz for our celebrations. **No** school cooked lunches, only sandwiches on this day.

Each class has been learning more about the difference between life at Braywood now and 80 years ago. Practicing a more straightforward curriculum to represent when Mr Snow was the headmaster. When looking back in the archives, it appears that Braywood struggled when it was first opened. There was usually a husband-and-wife team who lived in the Braywood Cottage and the original entrance from this building is still there. The inspections of the day suggested that the education at Braywood could have been better and there was evidence of children getting the cane on a regular basis.

One of the first vicars to support our school was the Revd Leigh Austin who was the nephew of the famous Jane Austin. We like to think that Queen Victoria came to tea because she was a huge friend of Elizabeth Van de Weyer who alongside her husband founded our school. Sarah Grace (Governor) has been researching all the headteachers since 1857

## Teaching, learning and the curriculum

## Changes that will be happening over the next few months.

#### Our assemblies

Every term our assemblies have a SEAL focus (Social and Emotional aspects of Learning). This is important because children are unable to learn if their mind is on other things.

Next term we are looking at 'Change' which will be very important for the children. Resilience is one of our Christian values which tells us to 'keep on trying' even if things change.

#### **Leadership**

This year some teachers have been looking at various aspects of senior leadership to support our School Development Plan. These areas have included developing mastery in Religious Education; how to support children and staff mental health and the global aspects / social injustice across the curriculum.

All these aspects develop a child's strength of character and their ability to cope with change.

#### Next Term

It is important to ensure that there will be a very smooth transition for our families for the next two terms. Mrs Annie Cole is very much looking forward to joining our established staff team. We aim to ensure that there will be minimal change for our parents and children to ensure a secure foundation for this change.

## Old Court Summer Performance

There are two full day rehearsals that will need parents to drop off / collect their child from the Old Court in Windsor. These are Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> July.

On the 16<sup>th</sup> of July all the Year 1 and 2 pupils are going to watch this performance and will need picking up from this venue.

Staff will operate a 'Kiss and Drop' facility from 9am – 9.15am to drop off and 2.30pm to 2.45pm to collect at the front of the Old Court. Please car share for this event as staff will not be able to bring children back to school due to insurance.

The concert is on 16<sup>h</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> July starting at 6.30pm. The Y3/4 parents need to arrive from 6.15pm. Staff will be available to take children backstage.

Performing on stage is such a rewarding experience and teaches children so many life skills. If you are a performer, please do attend both evenings performances as it is a team effort and we do really need each and every child.

#### **Sports Day**

Traditionally we always have our Sports Day on the last day of term.

The Whole School Family Assembly starts at 9.15am. Afterwards there will be some refreshments and the Sports Day will start at approximately 10.30am. This usually takes us up to lunchtime. All children stay and share a picnic on the field and the school fair will be held between 12.30 and 2pm.

This is a lovely way to say goodbye, to hear the Year 4 children ring the bell and for parents to share time together.

#### Pupils' Reports

At the end of the year. There will be an opportunity to look at your child's work over this academic year and collect their report from the teacher. The children have worked incredibly hard this year and it has been reflected in their progress.

#### Attendance and fines

Following on from the changes to attendance brought in by this Government, Braywood will start implementing fines for parents who take their child out of school without authorisation for 5 or more days. These do not have to be consecutive days

Penalties will be  $\pounds 160$  per child. Please see attached email. This is reduced to  $\pounds 60$  if paid within 21 days.

#### Dates for next Year

To maintain continuity, each class will be having a forest day to build up resilience and problem skills whilst being a supportive team player. The Year 1 pupils have the Wildness and Wonder team in school; Year 2 and 3 are going to Braywick and Year 4 go to Longridge to work together on several team building activities including water sports and laser tag.
