I am Josh



I am Josh. I have Down Syndrome. I am not Down Syndrome. I am Josh.

Down Syndrome is the common name for Trisomy 21. This means that I have three copies of my 21st chromosome, whereas most people only have 2. Because of this I have some physical characteristics that look different to other people, it is harder for me to learn and it is harder for me to work my muscles than other people.

When people realise I have Down Syndrome, most of them think my mother is really old. But actually, the average age of a mum at diagnosis is 28. My mum isn't quite that young but she keeps telling me she didn't come from the ark (he, he).

Some people feel very confused as they think that no one gets born with Down Syndrome now. But Down Syndrome cannot be prevented, and it cannot be cured. In fact, right now, it can't even always be accurately detected. In half the cases of Down Syndrome, it is only found at birth - just like me. But what people don't know is that we are miracles. Where Down Syndrome is detected, more than 90% people terminate their pregnancy and the nurses told me that, when found at birth, 20% babies are never taken home. So the fact that children like me survive and are in loving homes is quite miraculous.

The other thing most people don't realise is how much most Down Syndrome children have had to fight so far. About half of us are born with heart issues, and about 20% have bowel issues so many need surgery in the first few months of their life. Having Down Syndrome makes you more likely to get a large range of conditions – epilepsy, autism, poor vision etc. So far, I'm lucky to have missed most of these but I do have moderate hearing loss due to my ear canals being very small and being filled with fluid.

But actually life for me is very similar to another toddler. I learned to sit by myself at 8 months, learned to crawl at 10 months and now, at 19 months like to cruise around the house. The doctors seem to be quite impressed with my physical progress but they don't realise that I have a twin sister and an elder sister playing rough and tumble with me all the time. They don't give me any special treatment. Nothing like having to fight for attention (he, he). I sometimes can be naughty, but most of the time I am happy, determined, funny and very affectionate.

I do have a lot more appointments than the average child. I see audiology, orthoptics, orthotics, physio, a community paediatrician, teacher of the deaf, portage teacher... – the list is endless. They are always giving me more exercises to do so that people with Down Syndrome achieve more than they have ever done before.

And some scientists have decided that people with Down Syndrome might actually hold the clues to beating some pretty serious diseases. As an example, scientists believe they have detected some markers for Alzheimers. All people with Down Syndrome have these, but not all people with Down Syndrome develop Alzheimers. So scientists think that if they understand how some people with Down Syndrome beat them, they might be able to develop a cure for Alzheimers overall. They approached my mum, and so now my twin sister and I are participating in a medical study at Birbeck College to see if we can help them.

Probably the biggest challenge for me is learning to speak. Because of my learning disability I find it hard to learn what things are. Because of my hearing loss it's hard to hear different speech sounds clearly. And because my mouth muscles don't work well it's hard for me to make sounds. Luckily a group called Chatterbox is helping me. They provide private speech and language one a week where I learn exercises for my mouth and throat, practice making different sounds and learn words and how sentences are constructed.

I love meeting people and am always out and about. If you see me do come and chat. You might need to give me a bit more to respond because sometimes I have to think about things for a bit longer. But I'm very sociable and love meeting new people.

And remember, I am Josh. I have Down Syndrome but I am not Down Syndrome. I am Josh.

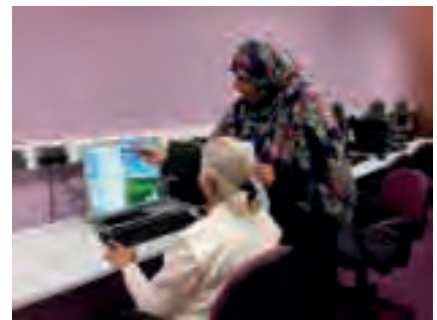

Purpose of Advisory Panel

- Ensure compliance with requirements of the Childcare Act 2006 and other statutory requirements and guidance
- To provide support and challenge to the Children's Centres Hub against national and local requirements i.e.: Ofsted, Sure Start
- Ensure the safeguarding of children is always a priority
- Participate in the development, progress and oversight of the Children's Centre Hub service delivery plan
- Work with the centre manager to identify local priorities through effective consultation
- Monitor progress against performance outcomes
- Ensure that within the Children's Centres Hub's capacity services meet local needs and contribute to meeting children's outcomes.
- Facilitate effective engagement between the community and the Children's Centres Hub in order to shape services

Privacy Notice – Sure Start Children’s Centres

Sure Start Children’s Centres work closely with partners in schools, the PCT, LA and other groups supporting children and families. Centres will be inspected by Ofsted. Data provided by you to the Children’s Centre will not be shared in a way that will identify either you or your child to any other organisation. Should it be felt that another organisation may be able to offer support to you or your child, you will be consulted before any information is shared¹.

Information you have provided can be removed from the database, should you request it.

Children, young people and their parents/carers, as data subjects, have rights under the Data Protection Act 1998, including a general right of access to personal data held about them, with parents exercising this right on children’s behalf if they are too young to do so themselves, (usually under 12 years old). ¹ The only exception to this is if it is considered that the well being of a child is at risk. The centre’s Child Protection policy states that if there is a concern for the well being of a child, this will be raised with the parents/carer in the first instance unless this is likely to increase the risk to that child, before a referral is made to Social Services.
