## Some of the trips and visitors we have had this term

#### Robot Wars

As you have seen from the front page of this newsletter there will be some changes to the staffing from September. We are very fortunate as we did not have to advertise for a teaching position as we have many excellent candidates inhouse. Mrs Teeder will be the fulltime teacher in our Foundation Stage and Mrs Rexworthy will be the full-time teacher in Year 3. There should be no issues with transition as that is all in hand and both teachers are looking forward to their new challenges. In September we will also be having a trainee teacher studying with us all year in Year 4.

It is not unusual to hear about the tight budgets that schools have to manage. It is no different at Braywood. We have seen our budget drop year on year and have the added challenge of the low birth rate in Windsor.

# Changes to our 'Kiss and Drop' and clubs

From September 2019 there will be more clubs on offer after school for your convenience including a long-awaited Homework Club. Do watch out for the September Newsletter. We are also considering holding a two-week summer camp.

We are also going to change our 'kiss and drop' provision. As usual we will be trialing this change and parents can express their opinion.

Also from September 2019, Kiss and Drop will now run from 8.20am to 8.40pm. The children will be still taken down into the playground between 8.40-8.45am. As the provision has been extended there will be a cost of £1 per family regardless of whether you have 2 or 3 pupils. We will take a register every morning and parents will be charged every half term through eschools.

Some parents will like this change because they do not have to queue on the road in the morning, others will not be as happy because they are being asked to pay for this facility. Kiss and Drop is a service which costs the school £15 a session due to staffing costs. This cost will increase with the increased timings to £20 a session from September. Please let me know any immediate thoughts through the office.

#### Greenredeem

I can't believe it but we are in the top three for our Greenredeem collection points again. Last year we received £1,000 and we may achieve that goal again. Please could you donate any further point as the scheme closes at the end of June.

### Family Assembly

## Teaching and learning

#### Results of the Parents' Survey

Ideas for the changes in our garden Firstly (thanks to the PTA) we are totally renovating our gymnastics equipment in the Church House. We are purchasing wooden wall bars, new benches and linking climbing equipment. This will cost approximately £6,500.

The PTA have also very kindly offered to purchase an outdoor gym and a traverse wall. This again will cost £7,000. The playground markings have been discussed by the children, governors and staff. This work will take place when we have completed the landscaping in the Foundation Stage.


