Lego Workshop with Year 4

In Year 4 the pupils always have the opportunity to make racing machines from Lego in the summer term. They have contests to see which design is the most successful. This has been paid for by the school.



Open Day at Windsor Great Park

Every two years Windsor Great Park opens its doors to all the Windsor Schools. It is a great opportunity to find out more about the practices on a farm. Year 3 and 4 had a wonderful time and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

Victorian Day

The Year 3 and 4 pupils had so much fun during their Victorian Day. They learnt a lot about life as a child in Victorian times so much so 4 pupils got the cane!

<u>Fun Run</u>

This is our second Fun Run event. The children ran even further than they did last year. There was a lovely atmosphere and we managed to raise over $\pounds 1,500$ (present total) for the school.

We will be raising money for some new Maths equipment for the whole school. We hope to purchase some mental arithmetic tools such as Cuisenaire rods, measuring equipment, coins and teaching materials. We also plan to paint the playground next year.

Standards and Progress

Early Years

This year 83% of pupils achieved a 'good level of development'.

Phonics

For the last two years our Year 1 pupils have achieved 97%-100% success rate on passing the Phonics Test. This is due to our excellent phonics scheme and curriculum.

Progress across the school

In Years 1, 2, 3 and 4 between 89% - 95% achieved nationally expected standards and made a similar degree of progress from last year's standards.

Similarly across the school we had between 30% - 50% of these pupils achieve beyond those expectations.



These achievements are down to our fantastic teaching team and strong and dedicated leadership. It is indicative of the hard work and passion of our teachers and teaching assistants. More detailed information will be in the Governors Report to Parents.

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Transition and Induction Days

The Year 4 pupils are visiting their next schools on Thursday 5th and Friday 6th July. On those days the pupils in school will also be visiting their new teacher and their next classroom. Children will be registered and dismissed using the normal routine.

The new children will also be in school on the Thursday.

Summer Concert

The Year 3 and 4 pupils are hard at work preparing for the production 'Olivia'. The tickets will be available from the office from the beginning of next week. We have two productions so there are plenty of tickets.

The younger siblings will have already seen the production at the dress rehearsal so we ask if possible that younger children do not attend the evening performance. If that is not possible they will have to sit with their parents on a seat. We are unable to accommodate them at the front on the benches because the performers need this space to act and dance.

Sports Day

We start this day with an outdoor family assembly and then we lead straight into our Sports Day. The children have been working very hard and they really enjoy this event. Parents are invited to stay and have a picnic on the field with us after the event. School closes at 2pm on this day.

The Year 4 parents are invited to stay and have a cup of tea with the teachers whilst your child rings the school bell.
