Covid Changes for this term

Braywood is trying to return to school life before Covid. We do, however, continue with many of the initiatives that are outlined in our risk assessment such as increased hygiene, ventilation, and infection control.

Although there is no longer a legal requirement for people with Coronavirus to self-isolate, the advice from PHE (and our school) has not changed. If you have any of the main symptoms of Covid 19 (or a positive test result) you should stay at home and avoid contact with others. If you have any Covid-19 symptoms, you can still order a PCR Test at <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u>. This applies to adults and children. Everyone is advised to stay at home until you have the results of your test. If you have Covid, children should stay at home for 5 days and return after two negative LFT. Household contacts (siblings) can still return to school as normal. At school if a child displays any symptoms that indicate that they are unwell we will send them home as usual.

World Book Day

As you will be aware most of the children had a lovely day last Thursday in their pajamas 'sharing a book'. The children have listened to the author Eamonn Reilly and **if you want** to buy his books the form needs to be in school by tomorrow morning. Children will also be able to spend their £1 world book day voucher at an Usborne book sale after school on 10th March.

Maths Day – 10th March

This day is going to focus on telling the time and using money. There will be a tuck shop planned on this day where your child can bring in $\pounds 1$ to spend.

We are wearing bright clothes and silly socks because we are raising money for Thames Valley Hospice alongside St George's School in Windsor.

<u>Science Day – 17th</u> <u>March</u>

This Thursday is our day to talk to the children about entrepreneurialism and we have been very fortunate to secure a talk from the lead company, Phifzer. This should be a great opportunity for the children. On this day there will be a sale of scientific gadgets for the children to explore. The office will be contacting children with allergies.

<u>Red Nose Day – 18th</u> <u>March</u>

Children will be able to purchase a red nose from the week commencing 14th March. We have only purchased enough for one per child.

Music Festival – 1st April

Mrs. Walker has planned an exciting day with a focus on musical expression. This will involve listening to a variety of music including an online drum ensemble.

This is our first Music Festival and if any parents would like to take part and play at instrument to the children that would be very much appreciated.

Dance Festival – 5th April

The Mighty Acorns (Year 1) are involved in their usual Dance Festival alongside many other Windsor schools. They will perform on stage for their parents in the afternoon.

There will be more information on this in due course.

Happiness and Wellbeing Day -6th April

This day will be a time when children can reflect upon their mental health. Most children are happy in school and are not presentina with anv real concerns, but 'Fantastic Fred' will be talking about strategies that they can use to manage any anxieties they may have in the future. This should complement the work that we have been doing in school well.

Remember, if you want your child to see our ESLA (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) let your teacher know. At present we only have one ELSA – Mrs Moss but we are hoping to train another adult soon.

One thing that does seem to be adding to some children's stress at the moment is playing video games at home that are designed for older children. The subject matter of 'killing' is not suitable for such young children, and they re-enact the content at playtime.

Please check what your child is playing with suitable game material and don't expose your child to the content (whether it is on a DVD, a game, or a movie) that is for much older children.

<u>Changes to our 'Grab</u> <u>and Go'</u>

The slight changes that we have made to the 'Grab and Go' arrangements seem to be working well. Parents need to park inside the staff car park, remembering to reverse into a space. This will allow you to leave the car park safely.

<u>Next Term</u>

The children have lots to look forward to next term. The most important events are associated with the Queen's Jubilee. The Windsor schools have a week of events planned to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee week commencing 23rd May.

Our Mighty Oaks will be preforming their summer concert at the Old Court in Windsor for the first time. This is a wonderful opportunity for both Year 3 and 4 to perform on an actual stage.

END OF TERM

School closes on Thursday 21st July at 2pm. There is no after school club on this day. We open again at 8.45am on Monday 5th September

The children in Year 2 will be taking their Statutory Assessment Tests in May for the first time in two years. Over the past two years our standards have remained high.

The children in Year 1 are working on their Statutory Phonics Screening Check. This is an important milestone and really does help a child's reading skills.

Both year groups are on task to do well.

Teaching and learning

In Year 4, the children must take their first Statutory Times Table Check. This is quite a challenge because the questions must be answered within 6 seconds and the answers inputted onto the computer system.

The children have been working all this year on their tables, but any help the Mighty Oak's parents can offer would be very much appreciated. This does sound like a lot of assessment that the government are expecting schools to perform. At Braywood this is integrated seamlessly into the curriculum and children are well prepared and often do not know when they are being assessed.

Your support does help though to maintain these high standards. Do come along to your child's consultation in April to see what is happening in your child's classroom and how you can help.
