# What has been happening in school? Curriculum, teaching and learning achievements.

#### Over 165 years at Braywood

We are hosting the third of three events that have celebrated the history of our school. This is probably going to be the third and final ball we host.

The values of Braywood back in 1857 are still as true today as they were when the school was first opened. A small rural village school serving its local community; that fosters an inspirational ethos and provides a good grounding to all children throughout the rest of their lives.

There is an invitation attached to this newsletter. Do please come and join us. We have a guest speaker, Frank Turner, who attended Braywood just after the war. There will be great food, dancing until midnight and sharing time with friends.

#### Special Days last term

Over many years at Braywood we have promoted high quality extracurricular experiences such as our Literacy. Maths, Entrepreneurial days. These days offer children the opportunity to expand upon their cultural capital and explore avenues that they may follow up as an adult. This year the author was a particular success and had a huge impact upon our writing skills.

## What have we been learning about?

## Emotional Regulation

#### **Blue Zone**

Every year we explore three different curriculum sessions on our mental health. This term we have booked a wellbeing day to help the children understand more about their feelings.

#### **Zones of Regulation**

Ask your child because they have been learning that there are 4 states of alertness in an emotional state. At school it is when a child is in the yellow zone that we try to teach strategies to remain in control of their behaviours. An understanding of this will help as a child gets older. This zone is used to describe a low state of alertness or emotion. The blue zone is used to describe when one feels sad, tired, sick or bored.

#### **Green Zone**

This zone is used to describe the ideal state for thinking and learning. A person may be described as calm, happy, focused or content when they are in the green zone. The person has a strong sense of internal control when in the green zone.

This is green and reminds us that this is the state we should be in school.

#### **Yellow Zone**

This zone is used to describe a heightened state of alertness or emotion. A person may be experiencing stress, frustration, anxiety, excitement, silliness or fear. The person's energy level is elevated yet they still have some internal control in the yellow zone.

#### **Red Zone**

This zone is used to describe an extremely heightened state of emotion. A person who is experiencing anger, panic, explosive behaviours or terror is in the red zone and feels a loss of control.



## **Booster Classes**

These sessions will start on Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April and will finish on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> May just before half term.

## <u>Trim trail</u>

Please remember that when children are on the trim trail or even the field, they are the responsibility of the parents. The gate is open, and staff are not supervising and there is a safeguarding risk due to the busy road. No ball or other equipment is allowed after school has finished.

## <u>May Fun Run</u>

#### Friday 24<sup>th</sup> May at 1.00pm

This is an enjoyable sponsored event at the Braywood Cricket Ground on the day we break up for half term.

The children run 1 mile around the cricket ground which is approximately 4 laps, and friends, grandparents or work colleagues can sponsor the children. The teachers walk the children down from school for 1pm and afterwards there are refreshments organised by the PTA. The Nursery will not be attending and will need collecting by 2pm

Staff will operate a 'Kiss and Drop' facility from 9am – 9.15am to drop off and 2.30pm to 2.45pm to collect at the front of the Old Court. Please car share for this event as staff will not be able to bring children back to school due to insurance complications.

The concert is on 17th & 18th July starting at 6.30pm. The Y3/4 parents need to arrive from 6.15pm. Staff will be available to backstage. take children Performing on stage is such a experience rewarding and teaches children so many life skills. If you are a performer, please do attend both evenings performances as it is a team effort and we do really need each and every child.

#### Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> July

As a treat for our Mighty Oaks, they will spend the early evening having a BBQ and fun events at school. Children will need to be in school at 4.30pm in their home clothes and collected at 6pm.

#### <u>Sports Day</u>

Traditionally we always have our Sports Day on the last day of term.

The Whole School Family Assembly starts at 9.15am. Afterwards there will be some refreshments and the Sports Day will start at approximately 10.30am. This usually takes us up to lunchtime. All children stay and share a picnic on the field and the school fair will be held between 12.30 and 2pm.
