Forest School Days

As you have probably heard from your child, we have had some very successful Forest School days to start this year off. During the trip to Longridge the children explored raft building, climbing and team building experiences whilst the younger children explored Braywick Nature reserve with an experienced guide. They made dens and shared treats around the campfire.

Year 1 had the Wild & Wilderness team that run our Forest School after school which was a special treat. This is a very popular club that uses our wild area.



These days really help the children settle into their new school. The first few days always has a pastoral theme which gives everyone in the school an opportunity to build new friendships, work as a team, and build individual resilience.

New Playground markings

Thank you to all the parents who contributed (past and present) towards this exciting new addition. Parents have probably noticed that we have new tarmac pathways alongside this project. The windows in the old part of the school have also been replaced with a double-glazed alternative.

Uniform

We appreciate all our parents supporting the uniform policy. Although we have a few branded items most of the uniform is unbranded and can be acquired at a low cost. Having a uniform can save parents being drawn into purchasing costly home clothes.

Please try to purchase the blazer if you are able rather than a coat. Most children will only need coat, hats and gloves on the really cold day and a vest, and a blazer is more than adequate. If you buy them big, they will last two years. The Braywood coat is also an excellent purchase for the younger children but can be worn further up the school.

Parents do donate secondhand uniform so do ask at the office as we only ask for a small donation.

<u>Harvest</u>

Friday 20th October

There are going to be some small changes to our Harvest celebrations.

Children in the Early Years unit (Foundation and Nursery) will be hosting a small harvest presentation with refreshments.

The rest of the school (Y1-4) will be performing in the Church House twice. The first time will be at 8.45am and the second at 1.30pm.

The school then closes at 2pm. There will be no grab and go or after school club on this day.

It is at this time of year that we have our 'meet the teacher' parent evenings. We are holding all class meetings on the same day, and they will start at approximately 3.30pm and run until approximately 7pm.

As you know parents are welcome to talk to their child's class teacher most days. Children with specific needs will have a separate appointment this term.

From half term all the children are expected to wear their winter uniform. Most days children are warm enough with a blazer and will only need a coat on cold days.

Teachers will be starting the usual 'catch-up' groups from after half term. Some children are coming into school early to start their phonics groups as well. Thank you for your support.

We will also be marking Armistice Day with the sale of poppies and merchandise can be purchased after half term. Our Year 4 pupils will be laying a wreath as usual.

At this time every year parents have the opportunity to have a 10-minute conversation with their child's new teacher. These are booked through our eschools system, and the office will send an email explaining the process nearer the time.

This will start around 3pm and conclude early evening.

As a school we are organizing a Christmas Meal for the whole school where the children wear Christmas jumpers. We provide a pantomime free of charge and a Christmas treat and if there is time, Christmas parties. Hopefully, Santa will be visiting!

We have a position on our Governing Body for the Clerk to the Governing Body. This is a role that involves attending training, 3 committee meetings annually, writing minutes etc. Parents cannot apply but if you know anyone who is interested, please do let the office know.

Teaching, Learning and our Curriculum

Getting to school on time

We ask parents to bring their child in on time as we need to start our lessons promptly.

The bell for Year 1 and Year 2 goes at 8.30am and teachers will close their door once all the parents have left. This usually takes 5 -10 minutes. Similarly, in Year 3 and Year 4 children line up in the playground when the bell rings and are taken into their classroom.

The gates will be closed at 8.50am - 8.55am and any parents arriving after that will need to come into school through the main door. Teachers are unable to add a child to their electronic register once they are late.

Nursery children are welcome to use the main door to enter the school.

Holidays in term time

For children to learn they need to be in school. We do not approve any term time holiday unless there are exceptional circumstances. Children need to understand that school needs to be attended every day. If they get used to taking time off this can lead to truancy and unreliable habits when they are in senior school.

Always ask at the office if you are unsure and send an email if your child will not be in school.
