What have been our successes?

Our standards have been exceptional this year. 100% of Year 1 achieved the phonics test in Year 1 and our average score for Year 4 times table test was 23.8 out of 25. Across the school most children have secured expected standards.

We have secured a strong good from Ofsted and an excellent report from our SIAMS inspection. Both inspections found very little areas that they felt that we could improve upon.

Next year we hope that we will have a new garden room in the Early Years area, that we have implemented the vast majority of Ofsted's next steps and that the new leadership add value to or school.
