Working alongside parents

Our annual parent, pupil and teacher's consultation day is on

Monday 10th February from 9am - 6pm

All parents are invited into school to discuss their child's education with their class teacher from 1pm to 6pm for 15 - minute periods. The older children (Y2, 3 and 4) will be attending the consultation with their teacher and parents as we are keen for the children to deliver their own learning objectives. The consultations will take place in the Church House, but parents will need to call into Class 2 to sign in and collect your child's work. PE and Sports this term

Every year group participates in either a sports tournament, a competition or a show. During March, Year 4 will compete in a Football competition and Year 1 will be performing in a Dance Show in April.

We have excellent sporting facilities and usually at the end of every year we are awarded with either a bronze or a silver 'kite' award.



To improve our Gymnastics' provision the PTA have raised over £8,000 to purchase a range of PE equipment including netball posts, agility stools, planks, ladders and wall bars. Most children have used this equipment with one class saying that 'this was the best PE lesson ever!'



Extended Schools

Our Breakfast and After School Club are always very popular. Our prices are very low in order to provide good value for money whilst offering interesting, fun activities and a healthy, but balanced menu.

Our Squirrel Club (ASC) now runs until 6pm. There is a £4 cost from 5.30pm to 6pm and a £4 charge for arriving after 6pm.

Literacy and Maths Days

During March we have a series of curriculum days to excite the children in these subject areas.

After the Literacy Day there is an opportunity to hear more about Reading, Phonics Test and the Year 2 SATS. This will be for the Foundation, Year 1 and 2 parents from 2.15pm in the Church House.

After the Maths Day there will also be a curriculum meeting outlining the various teaching techniques used in lessons to teach Maths. This meeting will be for Year 2, 3 and 4 parents at 2.15pm in the Church House.

Our Easter Performance

Our Easter performance is on Friday 3rd April at 1pm. Everyone is welcome and the school closes when the performance finishes.

We ask that Year 1-4 parents drop your child/ren off at St Michaels Church, Bray between 8.45 and 9am with a packed lunch, a drink, light snack and light coat inside a rucksack.

The children will eat lunch and have a break inside the Church Hall. This is where you will find all your child's belongings at the end of the performance

Our Foundation pupils will be taken to church by coach and will be part of the performance.

It would be appreciated if parents could work together and car share. There is **no opportunity for any parents to park on the church site** unless they have disabled passengers. Please park considerably towards Bray residents. There is plenty of suitable parking spaces e.g. Bray Cricket Car Park.
