

Progression in Year 3/P4

The following chart gives an overview of the 'Revisit' and 'New Learning' objectives that are covered across Year 3/P4, as well as the frequency with which they are taught. Any objectives that are only covered at the start of the year are covered in detail in Year 2/P3. Any objectives that are introduced towards the end of the year are covered again in Year 4/P5.

It is assumed that by the start of Year 3/P4, most children can:

- ▶ understand simple story structure (beginning, middle, end)
- ▶ say and write basic compound sentences using connectives: and, but, so, then
- ▶ say and write a short sequence of sentences
- ▶ use nouns, adjectives and adverbs to describe in speaking and writing
- ▶ talk and write about events using simple sequence words: First, Next, Then
- ▶ punctuate sentences using: capital letter, full stop, question mark, exclamation mark
