Holidays and lateness

It is so important that your child is in school as many days as possible. It may not appear important to parents, but children miss all sorts of valuable experiences, actual lesson time and a disruption to their education by not being in school. The expected level of attendance should be 95% and above. Absences are monitored by the Government and data is always on a school's census.

Similarly, if children are brought in late, they are missing their lesson time. Registration is over and phonics lessons start at 8.50am in KS1 and SPAG at 8.55am. Children are marked as late if they arrive through the main door as gates are closed.

END OF TERM School closes on Friday 31st March at 2pm. There is no after school club on this day.
