## **Uniform changes**

After much deliberation prior to Covid we have decided to make some subtle changes to our school uniform.

We will replace the fleece with a blazer. (See front page). This blazer is slightly more expensive, but we feel that it will offer a smarter look for our pupils; it will be kept inside the classroom and will not get as easily lost and it will be used every day to wear for outside play.

We have also decided to keep the rucksack instead of the traditional bookbag. It is so much more convenient to put books, lunchboxes, water bottles, coats inside one bag.

We are hoping that everyone will purchase a blazer, rucksack, jumper/cardigan, and full PE kit. The other uniform items are not compulsory and can be purchased at cheaper costs store e.g. trousers, dresses. We do not have a lot of uniform that has a logo and need to be purchased from School Direct, so we hope that parents will support our school to make this subtle change in our uniform.

## Old Court Summer Performance

This is wonderful opportunity to perform our summer production 'Olivia' on a real stage instead of in school.

There are two full day rehearsals that will need parents to drop off / collect their child from the Old Court in Windsor. These are Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> July. #### Dates for next Year

Each class will be having a forest day to build up resilience and problem skills whilst being a supportive team player. The Year 1 pupils have the Wildness and Wonder team in school; Year 2 and 3 are going to Braywick and Year 4 to Longridge.

#### **Class Meeting**

At the beginning of an academic year there are class meetings which are planned for the morning before the children go on their forest day. #### **Braywood Extra**

## Latest news on our data

#### **Phonics test**

Everyone in Year 1 has performed very well through the phonics test. Knowing your sounds are the building blocks of both reading and writing so we do start work on them early in Foundation.

#### **Times Tables Tests**

The Year 4 pupils have been working very hard, not just learning their times tables, but to be able to recall them in 6 seconds, 25 times in a row. This is quite a challenge, but they have proved very capable.

#### Key 1 SATS

At the end of Year 2 the DfE has decided to assess the standards of these 6–7-year-old children. It is very well organised and children usually like to do these activities.

This year is no different from the past trends, the children have excelled, which is especially impressive when you think of the disruption to their education that Covid has caused. Prior to Covid parents voted in favour of having a blazer and the staff and governors agree that this would be a positive step forward in the perception and reputation of our school.
