PTA and Platinum Jubilee Celebrations

As outlined above lots is happening to celebrate the Queen's platinum jubilee. Mrs Calvert is taking two children from Year 2 to visit the mayor along with many other schools in Windsor at the Guild Hall. There is a platinum tea party to celebrate this special milestone.

There is a green initiative 'plant a tree for the jubilee' where we have planted 60 small hedgerow trees in our grounds. We have also been invited to participate in a ceremony organized by Ascot racecourse where they have planted an established tree in Windsor Great Park. Each tree has a plaque with the school's logo on so do look out for our tree in the future.

We have also supported the British Legion by purchasing a plaque as a memory of this celebration. We are still hoping to put a time capsule together during our 'Colour after Covid' initiative where this plaque will be center stage. We have applied for funding to achieve this goal.

We have nominated one of our teachers, Sarah Walker, to attend a dinner at Eton College for her contribution towards music at Braywood. I could have chosen so many of my staff for this award!

Red Nose Day and Dogs for the Blind

We raised £105 for Red Nose Day and £75 for dogs for the blind. Thank you for your contributions.

St George's School in Windsor

Our school has a mutually supportive relationship with this school. This term a small number of Year 4 pupils are attending a DT workshop and later a larger number of Year 3 and 4 pupils are participating in a cricket festival.

This school recognizes that the children who leave our school in Yar 4 are not only high performing, but they also have real character. This is why some Year 4 pupils offered an 80% bursary to join their school.

The children will be walking down to Braywood Cricket ground for the start of the Fun Run at 1pm.

It is a sponsored event where the children must try to run around the cricket field at least 5 times.

After the event there will be cake stall with a jubilee theme, ice cream and parents are encouraged to bring their own picnic treats.
